



BACKGROUND INFORMATION ABOUT THE DISTRICT

The district of Chatra, gateway of Jharkhand is abundant in scenic picnic spots and rich in fountains, water falls and in flora and fauna. Chatra is situated in the North-west of Jharkhand State at a latitude of 23⁰44'44"N - 24⁰31'43"N and longitude of 84⁰27'00"E – 85⁰21'03"E. Chatra was carved out of Hazaribagh district as a separate district in the year 1991. In ancient times it was administrative headquarter of Chotanagpur Commissionery which became a subdivision in 1914. It has largest area under forest in Jharkhand (236197 ha.) The district has also little reserve of minerals like coal, mica and limestone. Kunda fort nearby Pratappur, Bhadrakali temple of Itkhori block and Kalua hill are the places of historical importance in the district.

It comprises one subdivision with 10 Community Development Blocks, viz. Itkhori, Chatra, Hunterganj, Pratappur, Simariya, Tandwa, Kunda, Lawalaung, Giddhaur and Pathalgadda. There are altogether 159 village panchayats and 1479 villages in the district.

Total population of the district is 790680 of which 748690 are rural and remaining 41990 are urban (2001 census). The population of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes 255884 and 30251 respectively. The block-wise population distribution with sex ratio and literacy rate of the district as per 2001 census is given below.

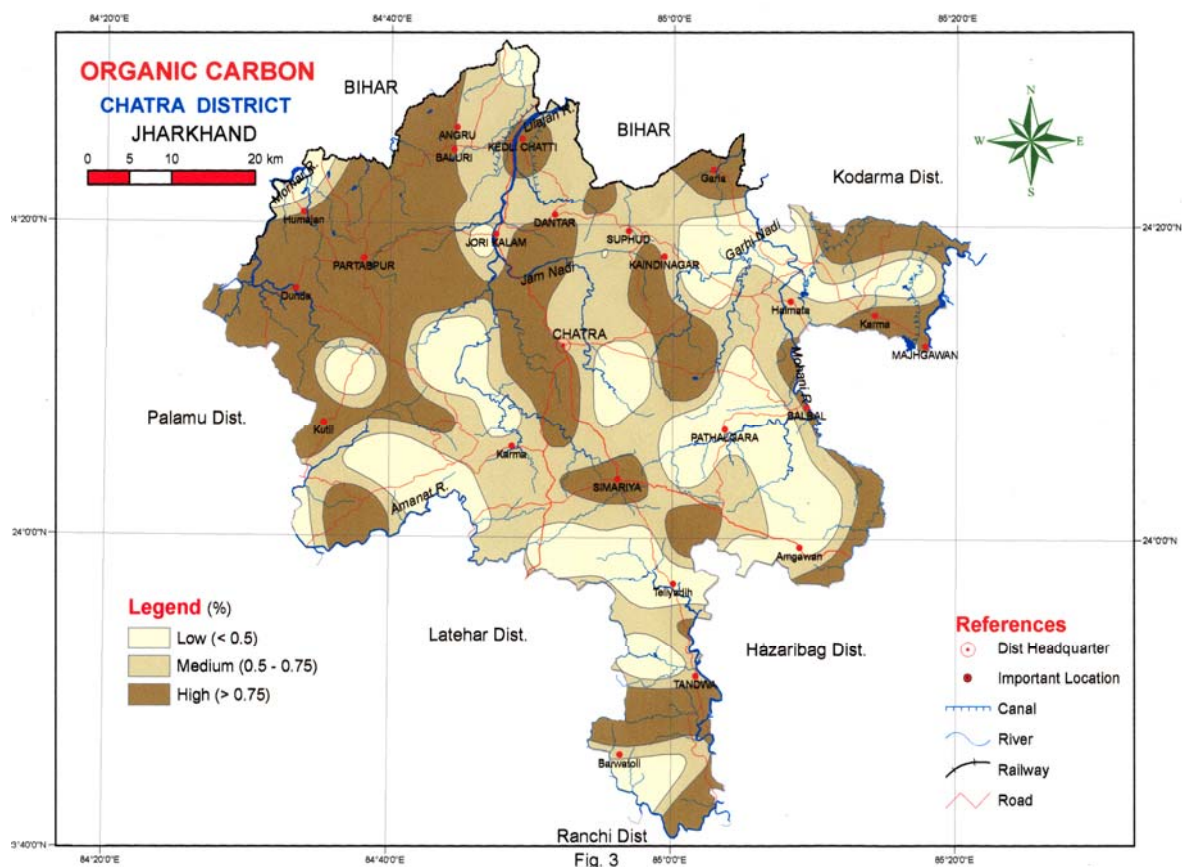

Type of Soil

Chatra is an agriculture-based district. Due to lack of any major industry majority of the population depends on agriculture for their livelihood.

Soil of Chatra is sedimentary in nature. As per soil survey, conducted earlier soil of this region is yellow-reddish and yellow, medium to deep, light textured soil. Soil of the area is light with good drainage. Soil acidity ranges from high to medium (P^H 4.0 - 6.0). Soil is deficient in N, P, Ca and Mo. Soil is poor in organic matter due to which available plant nutrients are low. Soil being light in texture water holding capacity and nutrient holding capacity is poor. Erosion of upper layer of soils of cultivated area is also a major problem. Soil is rich in iron and coal minerals, specially found in some blocks.

(i). Socio- economic Activity

(a) Agricultural Activity

The agricultural activities are in very primitive stage in most of the areas due to lack of investment for creating irrigation facilities and land development etc. The agricultural activities are, therefore, solely dependent on rainfall and its distribution during monsoon. In most of the time of the year land remains fallow after monsoon months. There is almost no activities in the field and there is no employment opportunities in the villages. Agriculture is mainly mono-cropped under rain-fed condition with poor yield potential. Double cropping is limited to irrigated areas where various vegetables, potato and wheat are grown. The per capita food grains production is 128 kg compared to 118 kg in Jharkhand. Agriculture and allied activities cover 85.15% of population. Manufacturing industries cover 1.5 %, household industry 1.88% and mining and quarrying 0.73% of total population.

From the survey of the villages and discussion with various sections of villagers, public representatives, grassroot level government functionaries in Gram Panchayats and Blocks, it was transpired that given proper direction and flow of fund there is ample scope to develop the country side by providing necessary road network, electricity, soil and water conservation activity, rain-water harvesting, afforestation and plantation of various fruit plants in and around

homesteads of poor people in general and SC and ST families below the poverty level in particular.

The horticultural nurseries established and plantations done earlier in Government land and by progressive farmers promise a very bright future for the rural families. Large scale farm forestry and plantation of fruit plants in villages will ensure better water conservation and recharge the ground water table.

(b) Industrial Activity / Rural Industry

Manufacturing industries cover 1.5 %, household industry 1.88 % and mining and quarrying 0.73% of the total population.

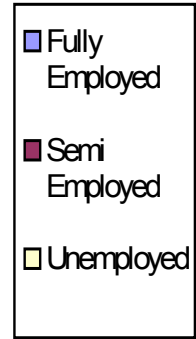
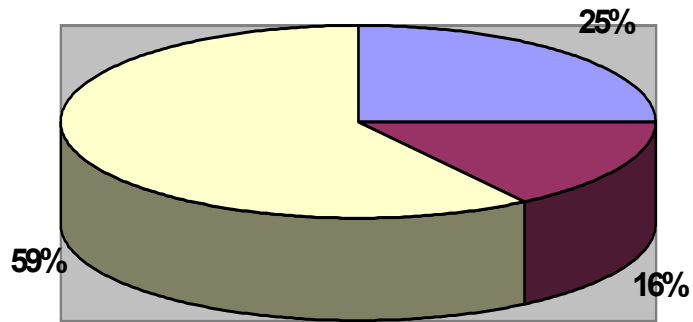
Block-wise status of work force



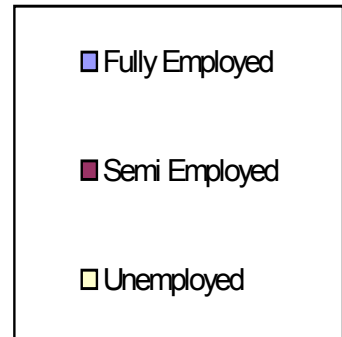
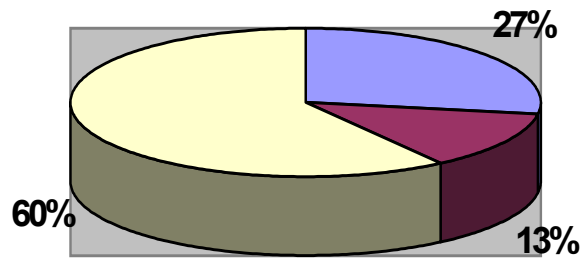
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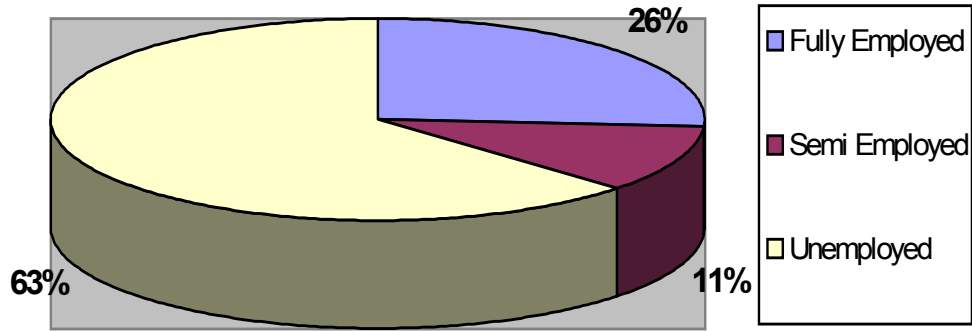
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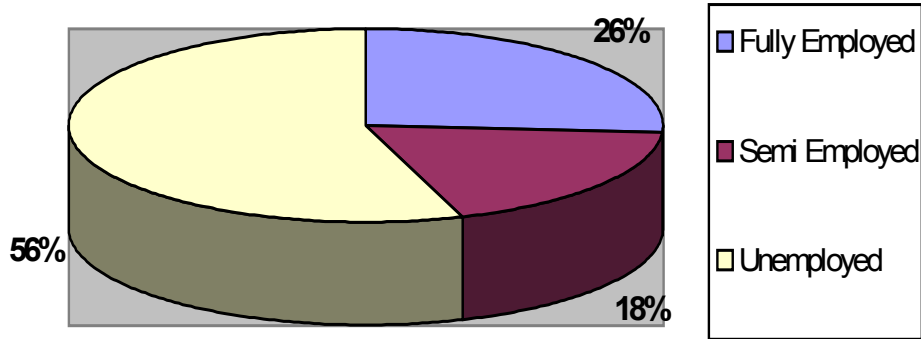
